### ACT 725 QUESTIONS

**1. I own a telecommunications service and I also install alarm systems. Am I affected by Act 725?**

No. Telecommunications, alarm systems, and other low-voltage applications are specialty classifications and are not affected under Act 725. Any contractor currently licensed with these classifications will **NOT** have to apply for any of the electrical classifications created in response to Act 725.

**2. I am a contract laborer working for a company that provides labor for construction. Do I have to be licensed?**

No. The company that provides labor must be licensed. The contract that you sign with the company that provides labor for construction is a labor contract not a construction contract. However, if you as an individual act as a contractor and sign a construction contract, then you **WILL** have to be licensed.

**3. I have a local electrical license and I've held it since before July 1, 2008. I took the test for the license. What do I need to do?**

You will have to submit a copy of the license which clearly shows that it was issued before July 1, 2008. It must be a master electrician's license. In addition, you must submit a copy of your master electrician exam results and a copy of the content outline of the exam which you must obtain from the testing company that wrote the master electrician exam which you took.

**4. Which are the national testing companies that have been approved by the Board?**

We will be approving national testing companies on a case-by-case basis. Many of the national testing companies that administered or wrote exams are no longer in business and we anticipate that it will take some time to finalize a list. We will be posting approved examinations on our website as we approve them.
