

CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSED CONTRACTORS

Continuing Education maintains the professional integrity of the construction industry through ongoing learning without placing an unnecessary regulatory burden on the licensed contractor. Therefore, as was made effective January 20, 2012, and in accordance with Rules and Regulations Section 113(B) of the State of Louisiana's Contracting Licensing Law:

"A residential building contractor shall be required to complete a minimum of six (6) hours of Continuing Education annually by a board approved provider. Proof of compliance with this requirement shall be filed with the board annually in the format required by the board, as a condition for the maintenance and/or renewal of the license."

Rules and Regulations Section 113(B) of the State of Louisiana's Contracting Licensing Law also includes the following exception to this requirement:

"A contractor who holds a valid, current commercial license in the major classifications of: building construction; highway, street and bridge construction; heavy construction; or municipal and public works construction, shall be deemed to have fulfilled this requirement."
