# 7-52 Roofing & Sheet Metal, Siding

### Classification Description

Refers to the installation, maintenance or repair of roof systems, including membrane, asphalt shingle, composite shingle, metal, clay tile, wood shingle, wood shake, slate, and foam for buildings and structures. Includes roof decks, and waterproofing for associated parapet walls including flashings and other accessories. Also includes general sheet metal. Siding made of various materials such as wood, vinyl, aluminum, Hardie board is also included in this classification.



# Introduction

Roofing & Sheet Metal, Siding is a closed book examination with 50 multiple-choice questions and a minimum passing score of 70.

You will have two hours to complete this examination.
