Mr. Fine made a motion to accept the Minutes of the December 20, 2017, Residential Building Subcommittee Meeting. Mr. Hamilton seconded. The motion passed.

Mr. Hassert introduced Alex Reinboth with the Louisiana Attorney General’s office and Chris Bodet, a new compliance investigator for the board.

**NEW BUSINESS**

**C. INSURANCE HEARINGS:**

**RESIDENTIAL BUILDING, HOME IMPROVEMENT, AND MOLD REMEDIATION; GENERAL LIABILITY & WORKERS’ COMPENSATION** – La. R.S. 2150–2192, 2186(B)(6), 2189(A)(7) and Rules and Regulations Sec. 1503(D)

Applications Supervisor Elaine Riggins was called to the stand and sworn in to give testimony regarding the documentation of general liability and workers’ compensation insurance coverage. Ms. Laborde removed A-1 PORTER CONSTRUCTION AND RENOVATIONS, L.L.C.; CAJUN NAVY CONSTRUCTORS LLC; and PRECISION BUILT CONSTRUCTION, INC from the agenda. Ms. Riggins also confirmed service for the remaining entities listed on the agenda. Ms. Riggins confirmed that this is the first violation for these companies except for CALEB L. MARTIN and PINNACLE BUILDERS, INC., which was their second violation.

Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board. Mr. Wyman made a motion a motion to suspend the license/registration back to the date of last insurance coverage, to issue a cease and desist order, assess \$250 in administrative cost, to allow the company’s license/registration to be reissued upon proof of insurance coverage and to allow staff to reinstate the license or registration and rescind the administrative costs if proof of no lapse is provided. Mr. Guidry seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Kelita Pete was present on behalf of FAMILY RESOURCES OF NEW ORLEANS, INC. and was sworn in. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board. Ms. Pete gave a statement and stated that the insurance certificate was emailed to staff. This matter was recessed in order for staff to confirm receipt of the email.

Mr. Hamilton seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mike Roblin was present on behalf of PINNACLE BUILDERS, INC. and was sworn in. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board. Mr. Roblin gave a statement and affirmed that there was a lapse in insurance coverage. Mr. Guidry made a motion a motion to suspend the license/registration back to the date of last insurance coverage, to issue a cease and desist order, assess \$500 fine plus \$250 in administrative cost, and to allow the company's license/registration to be reissued upon proof of insurance coverage. Mr. Wyman seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.
