Mr. Wyman made a motion to accept the Minutes of the April 18, 2018, Residential Building Subcommittee Meeting. Mr. Hamilton seconded. The motion passed.

Mr. Hassert introduced guest Alicia Wheeler with the Louisiana Attorney General’s office.

Leann Evans with the Compliance Department, Elaine Riggins with the Applications Department and Brad Hassert with the Compliance Department for the board were sworn in.

**C. INSURANCE HEARINGS:**

**RESIDENTIAL BUILDING, HOME IMPROVEMENT, AND MOLD REMEDIATION; GENERAL LIABILITY & WORKERS’ COMPENSATION** – La. R.S. 2150–2192, 2186(B)(6), 2189(A)(7) and Rules and Regulations Sec. 1503(D)

Applications Director Elaine Riggins was called to the stand to give testimony regarding the documentation of general liability and workers’ compensation insurance coverage. Ms. Riggins also confirmed service for the remaining entities listed on the agenda under C. Insurance Hearings.

Mr. Landreneau made a correction to the agenda which was for NEW ORLEANS EAST POOL & PATIO, INC. to be changed to N.O. EAST POOL & PATIO, INC.

Judge White read aloud the remaining entities listed under C. Insurance Hearings and asked the entities to make an appearance.

Mr. Wyman made a motion to suspend the license or registration of the aforementioned companies and individuals back to the date of last insurance coverage, to issue a cease and desist order, to assess a \$500 fine plus \$500 in administrative cost, to allow the company's license/registration to be reissued upon proof of insurance coverage and to allow staff to reinstate the license or registration if proof of no lapse is provided. Mr. Morse seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

The remaining entity listed under C. Insurance Hearings previously had one or more insurance violations. No one was present on behalf of JNG REMODELING SPECIALISTS LLC. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board regarding is entity. Mr. Wyman made a motion to revoke the license/registration for JNG REMODELING SPECIALISTS LLC, to issue a cease and desist order, and to assess a \$500 fine plus \$500 in administrative cost. Mr. Morse seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Will Fluitt was present on behalf of 1<sup>ST</sup> PSALM BUILDERS L.L.C. and was sworn in. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board. Mr. Fluitt gave a statement and affirmed that there was a lapse in insurance coverage. Mr. Wyman made a motion to suspend the license/registration back to the date of last insurance coverage, to issue a cease and desist order, assess \$250 fine and \$250 in administrative cost, to allow the company's license/registration to be reissued upon proof of insurance coverage and to allow staff to reinstate the license or registration and rescind the administrative costs if proof of no lapse is provided. Mr. Morse seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

James William Molter Jr. was present on behalf of JAMES WILLIAM MOLTER SR. and was sworn in. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board. Mr. Molter gave a statement and affirmed that there was a lapse in insurance coverage. Mr. Wyman made a motion a motion to suspend the license/registration back to the date of last insurance coverage, to issue a cease and desist order, assess \$250 in administrative cost, to allow the company's license/registration to be reissued upon proof of insurance coverage and to allow staff to reinstate the license or registration and rescind the administrative costs if proof of no lapse is provided. Mr. Hamilton seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence and it was admitted. Mr. Landreneau questioned Mr. Perkins. Mr. Perkins gave a statement to the board. The board questioned Mr. Perkins. Mr. Wyman made a motion to find PERKINS CONTRACTORS, LLC to be in violation. Mr. Morse seconded. The motion passed. Mr. Wyman made a motion to assess a \$500 fine plus \$500 in administrative costs, to allow the fine to be reduced to \$500 in administrative costs only if the company obtains a proper license/registration within 90 days. Mr. Morse seconded. The motion passed.

2. **JAMES M. ZEAGLER, JR.**, Ball, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2175.3(A)(1)(7)

Ms. Evans gave a summary of the allegations. No one was present on behalf of JAMES M. ZEAGLER, JR. Investigator Scott Corley was called to the stand and was sworn in. Mr. Corley reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence and it was admitted. Mr. Hamilton made a motion to find JAMES M. ZEAGLER, JR. to be in violation. Mr. Morse seconded. The motion passed. Mr. Corley confirmed service regarding the notice of hearing. Mr. Hamilton made a motion to assess the maximum fine plus \$1000 in administrative costs and to issue a cease and desist order. Mr. Wyman seconded. The motion passed.
