Mr. Fine led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Judge Darrell White gave the invocation.

Mr. Wyman made a motion to accept the Minutes of the May 17, 2017, Residential Building Subcommittee Meeting. Mr. Fine seconded. The motion passed.

Mr. Hassert introduced guests Ronald Burrough, Jim Seago and Alberto DePuy with the Louisiana Attorney General’s office.

**NEW BUSINESS**

**C. INSURANCE HEARINGS:**

**RESIDENTIAL BUILDING, HOME IMPROVEMENT, AND MOLD REMEDIATION; GENERAL LIABILITY & WORKERS’ COMPENSATION** – La. R.S. 2150–2192, 2186(B)(6), 2189(A)(7) and Rules and Regulations Sec. 1503(D)

Applications Supervisor Elaine Riggins was called to the stand and sworn in to give testimony regarding the documentation of general liability and workers’ compensation insurance coverage. Ms. Riggins removed BROUSSARD CONNAUGHTY CONSTRUCTION LLC; COLONIAL CONTRACTING INC; GARY ATTARDO; GEORGE ALLEN PRICE III; HARRIS BUILDERS L.L.C.; and TROY BROWN CONSTRUCTION, LLC from the agenda. Ms. Riggins also confirmed service for the remaining entities listed on the agenda.

Donald Biggs was present on behalf of BIGGS CONSTRUCTION, L.L.C. and was sworn in. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board. Mr. Briggs affirmed that there was a lapse in insurance coverage and gave a statement to the board. Mr. Briggs also stated that he had requested to place his license/registration on inactive status. Mr. Wyman made a motion dismiss this matter. Mr. Fine seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Kevin Smith was present on behalf of CAJUNLAND ELECTRIC INC. and was sworn in. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board. Mr. Smith gave a statement and affirmed that there was a lapse in insurance coverage. Mr. Wyman made a motion to suspend the license back to the date of last

insurance coverage, to issue a cease and desist order, assess \$250 in administrative costs, and to allow the company's license/registration to be reissued upon proof of insurance coverage. Mr. Fine seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Jose Garrido was present on behalf of JNG REMODELING SPECIALISTS LLC and was sworn in. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board. Mr. Garrido gave a statement and affirmed that there was a lapse in general liability insurance coverage. Mr. Wyman made a motion to suspend the license back to the date of last insurance coverage, to issue a cease and desist order, assess \$250 in administrative costs, and to allow the company's license/registration to be reissued upon proof of insurance coverage. Mr. Fine seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Otitle Nash was present on behalf of PEOPLES HOME IMPROVEMENTS L.L.C. and was sworn in. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board. Mr. Nash gave a statement and affirmed that there was a lapse in insurance coverage. Mr. Wyman made a motion to suspend the license back to the date of last insurance coverage, to issue a cease and desist order, assess \$250 in administrative costs, to allow the company's license/registration to be reissued upon proof of insurance coverage and to allow staff to dismiss this matter and rescind the fine if proof of no lapse is provided. Mr. Fine seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Attorney Todd Hebert was present on behalf of TALLULAH CONSTRUCTION, INC. and was sworn in. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board. Mr. Hebert gave a statement and affirmed that there was a lapse in insurance coverage. Mr. Wyman made a motion to suspend the license back to the date of last insurance coverage, to issue a cease and desist order, assess \$250 in administrative costs, to allow the company's license/registration to be reissued upon proof of insurance coverage and to allow staff to dismiss this matter and rescind the fine if proof of no lapse is provided. Mr. Fine seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

No one was present on behalf of ADC CONSTRUCTION LLC; B&B CONSTRUCTION AND REMODELING LLC; DALI PAINTING & RENOVATIONS LLC; DANIEL EDWARDS HOME IMPROVEMENTS, LLC; DANIEL REYES CONSTRUCTION L.L.C.; EDDIE ROSS; INTEGRITY CONSTRUCTION GROUP, L.L.C.; KEVIN TIMOTHY MCDANIEL; PERMENTER FAMILY HOME BUILDERS, L.L.C.; ROBERT DEWAYNE JOHNSON; STONE INTERIORS - NEW ORLEANS, L.L.C.; and TSD BUILDERS, INC. Mr. Wyman made a motion to suspend the license or registration of the aforementioned companies and individuals back to the date of last insurance coverage allowing staff to reinstate the license or registration if proof of no lapse is provided, to issue a cease and desist order, to assess \$500 in administrative costs, and to allow the company's license/registration to be reissued upon proof of insurance coverage. Mr. Fine seconded, and the motion passed.

No one was present on behalf of HENRY LEE FONTENOT JR. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board and stated that this is Mr. Fontenot's second offense. Mr. Wyman made a motion to revoke the license/registration back to the date of last insurance coverage for a period of one year, to issue a cease and desist order, and to assess a \$500 fine plus \$500 in administrative costs. Mr. Fine seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

No one was present on behalf of TONY RAY PASS. Ms. Riggins provided testimony to the board and stated that this is Mr. Pass's second offense. Mr. Wyman made a motion to revoke the license/registration back to the date of last insurance coverage for a period of one year, to issue a cease and desist order, and to assess a \$500 fine plus \$500 in administrative costs. Mr. Fine seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Rawls gave a summary of the allegations. Attorney Steven Watterson was present on behalf of RADIANT HOME IMPROVEMENTS LLC. Attorney Seth Dornier was present on behalf of SOUTHERN REMODELERS & KITCHEN LLC. Mr. Watterson entered a denial plea. Mr. Dornier entered a denial plea. Investigator Marianne Sullivan was called to the stand and was sworn in. Ms. Sullivan provided testimony to the board and reviewed the exhibit packets for both companies. Mr. Bankston entered the exhibit packet into evidence for Radiant Home Improvements LLC. Mr. Watterson objected to several exhibits within the exhibit packet of Radiant Home Improvements LLC. Judge White overruled the objections and the exhibit packet was admitted. Mr. Bankston entered the exhibit packet into evidence for Southern Remodelers & Kitchen LLC. Mr. Dornier objected to several exhibits within the exhibit packet for Southern Remodelers & Kitchen LLC. Judge White overruled the objections and the exhibit packet was admitted. Mr. Watterson and Mr. Dornier both gave closing statements to the board. A discussion took place between the board, Mr. Watterson, Mr. Dornier and Mr. Bankston. Mr. Mallett made a motion to find RADIANT HOME IMPROVEMENTS LLC to be in violation. Mr. Fine seconded. The motion passed. Mr. Mallett made a motion to find SOUTHERN REMODELERS & KITCHEN LLC to be in violation. Mr. Fine seconded. The motion passed. After discussion, Mr. Wyman made a motion to assess \$1000 in administrative costs and to place RADIANT HOME IMPROVEMENTS LLC on one year probation. Mr. Fine seconded. The motion passed. Mr. Wyman made a motion to assess reduce the previous fine for SOUTHERN REMODELERS & KITCHEN LLC to \$1000 fine plus \$1000 in administrative costs and to assess an additional \$1000 in administrative costs if the company obtains a license by December 31, 2017. Mr. Wyman continued the motion to state that if SOUTHERN REMODELERS & KITCHEN LLC does not obtain a proper license and/or registration by December 31, 2017 the fine will be \$26,800 plus \$1000 in administrative costs. Mr. Wyman also placed SOUTHERN REMODELERS & KITCHEN LLC on one year probation. Mr. Fine seconded. The motion passed.
