



4. a) **COAST BUILDERS, L.L.C.**, Slidell, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2158(A)(4)

Ms. Morgan gave a summary of the allegations and read the settlement offer presented by COAST BUILDERS, L.L.C. Mr. Wyman made a motion to accept the settlement offer as presented, which included a no contest plea. Mr. Morse seconded. The motion passed.

- b) **NOBI CONSTRUCTION INC.**, Pearl River, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2167(A)

Ms. Morgan gave a summary of the allegations and read the settlement offer presented by NOBI CONSTRUCTION INC. Mr. Morse made a motion to accept the settlement offer as presented, which included a no contest plea. Mr. Wyman seconded. The motion passed.

5. **BOBBY AUTIN D/B/A BOBBY'S FLOORS & RENOVATIONS**, Madisonville, Louisiana – La. R.S. 37:2175.3(A)(1) & 2175.3(A)(4)

Mr. Morse made a motion to find UNDER PRESSURE CONSTRUCTION, L.L.C. to be in violation, to assess the maximum fine plus \$1000 in administrative costs and to issue a cease and desist order. Ms. Sullivan reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence and it was admitted. After discussion, Mr. Hamilton made a motion to assess an administrative penalty of a \$1000 fine plus \$500 in administrative costs, to issue a cease and desist order and to allow the administrative penalty to be reduced to \$500 in administrative costs only if the company obtains the proper license within 120 days. Mr. Wyman made a motion to accept the plea. Mr. Hamilton seconded. The motion passed. Investigator Bobbie Hughes was called to the stand and was sworn in. Ms. Hughes reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence and it was admitted. Mr. Wyman made a motion to assess an administrative penalty of a \$2000 fine plus \$1000 in administrative costs and to issue a cease and desist order. Mr. Wyman continued the motion to allow the administrative penalty, along with the outstanding administrative penalty from a previous matter, to be combined and reduced to \$1000 plus \$1000 in administrative costs only if the company obtains the proper license. Mr. Hamilton seconded. The motion passed.

Ms. Morgan gave a summary of the allegations. Whitney Dickerson was present on behalf of RYTAM CONSTRUCTION SERVICES, INC. and was sworn in. Mr. Dickerson entered a no contest plea. Mr. Wyman made a motion to accept the plea. Mr. Hamilton seconded. The motion passed. Compliance Director Brad Hassert, who was previously sworn, was called to the stand. Mr. Hassert reviewed the exhibit packet and provided testimony to the board. Mr. Landreneau entered the exhibit packet into evidence and it was admitted. The board questioned Mr. Dickerson and Mr. Hassert. Mr. Dickerson gave a statement to the board and stated that he does not dispute the records or any of Mr. Hassert's testimony.
